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From the Superintendent's Desk

We have only three weeks left in this instructional period, and our students are continuing to grow and learn each day. I hope your Thanksgiving Holiday was rewarding and you took some quality and quantity time to relax and enjoy friends and family. The following are some days on the school calendar in December to make a special note of on your calendars for planning purposes. The K-12 Christmas program is scheduled for Monday, December 8th beginning at 6:00 p.m.. The 19th, which is a 1:30 dismissal, is the end of the second quarter/first semester and the final day of classes before Christmas break. School will resume on January 5, 2026.

I would like to remind everyone of some very important winter information which we also shared in the November edition of the newsletter. When the <u>windchill factor/feel like</u> <u>temperature</u> is 20 degrees Fahrenheit or below, the students will be allowed to enter the building upon arrival to school prior to the entry bell sounding and wait in an orderly manner for entry into the classrooms. The students who participate in the breakfast program, will eat breakfast and remain seated in the cafeteria until the entry into classrooms.

When we experience inclement weather severe enough to cause a late start or a school closure, we will make the announcement, first and foremost, through the district's PowerSchool Messenger Mass Notification System. We will also utilize local news media outlets for inclement weather information. 1011 KOLN is the main outlet we use. Stay tuned to these information sources for winter weather information.

Our One-Act Play cast is preparing for another successful season with the results of the conference contest and district contest unavailable at the time this message was produced. The junior high boys wrestlers and girls basketball players have had contests already and are enjoying their seasons. Our other winter high school NSAA activity practices are well underway with the first contests beginning soon. I am looking forward to our players, coaches, and spectators representing NGSE with a great competitive spirit while displaying excellent sportsmanship throughout the winter seasons. 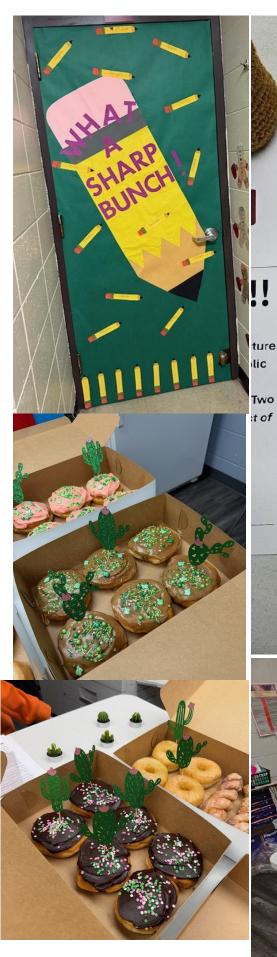

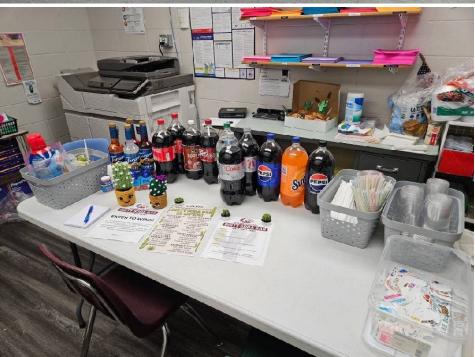

As we look forward to our peak shipping season, we would like to remind you of the address procedure as a PO Box owner.

Your mailing address is as follows:

PO Box ###

St. Edward, NE 68660

When providing your address to correspondents, it is only necessary to provide the PO Box number. You may often find that correspondents also request your physical address. In this instance, there are generally two fields available — "address" and "mailing address — if different than physical address". You will always provide your PO Box address in the mailing address field.

We realize that when you are ordering packaged items, some companies will not accept your PO Box address. If you encounter this situation, please do one of the following:

- Check that you have entered the physical address in the first field and the PO Box address in the second field.
- Enter only the number of your PO Box address after your physical address (ex. 111 First St 935)
- 3) Enter your PO Box number in the apartment number field.

It is our priority to ensure all your mail and packages are delivered correctly and in a timely fashion. Correct addressing is essential to providing you with excellent service, not only through the holiday season but every day.

Al proporcionar su dirección a los corresponsales, solo es necesario proporcionar el número de apartado postal. A menudo puede encontrar que los corresponsales también solicitan su dirección física. En este caso, generalmente hay dos campos para completar: "dirección" y "dirección postal", si es diferente de la dirección física. Siempre ingresará su dirección de apartado postal en el campo de dirección postal.

Nos damos cuenta de que cuando pides artículos empaquetados, algunas empresas no aceptarán tu dirección de apartado postal. Si se encuentra con esta situación, realice una de las siguientes acciones:

- Compruebe que ha introducido la dirección física en el primer campo y la dirección del apartado de correos en el segundo campo.
- Ingrese solo el número de su dirección de apartado postal después de su dirección física (por ejemplo, 111 First St 935)
- Ingrese su número de apartado postal en el campo del número de apartamento.

Five Indian Tribes of Nebraska

Thursday, November 6, 2025, Nancy Gillis with the Nebraska Humanities presented Third through Sixth graders information about Five Nebraska Indian Tribes. The five she told us about were the Omaha (U-Mo-Ho), Ponca, I'Santi (Santee, a tribe from Minnesota), Winnebago (a tribe from Wisconsin), and the Pawnee. She explained where these tribes lived and how they were moved by various governmental Indian treaties. Most Nebraska tribes were peaceful.

I asked the fifth graders for their comments about the presentation. Most were concerned about Indian children being forcefully taken to boarding schools around the country. Many times the children were punished in boarding school for using their native language.

Jasper and Evelin noted the animal skins on display. There was a beaver, badger, and mink pelts, and a bobcat head skin.

Tyson and Tallia talked about learning the word "thank you" in the different languages of the tribes. Nancy talked to the children about the importance of preserving the Native American language. She also mentioned that it was not the word used to talk about the Indians, but the respect behind the use of the terms Native American or Indian.

Students toured the campus, attended a college student panel, and took part in hands-on activities related to their career interests. 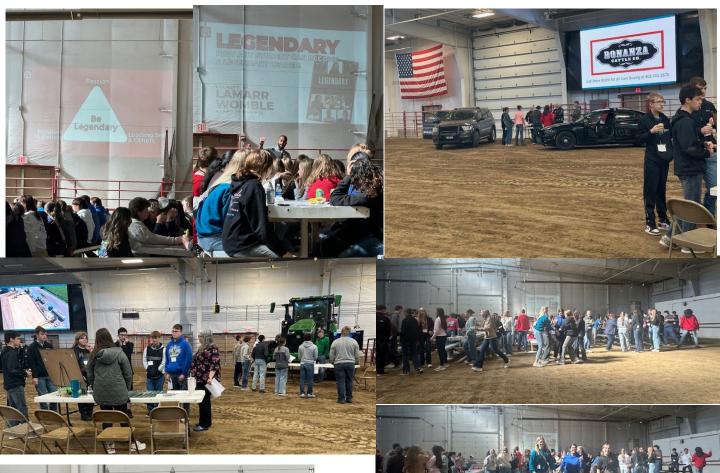

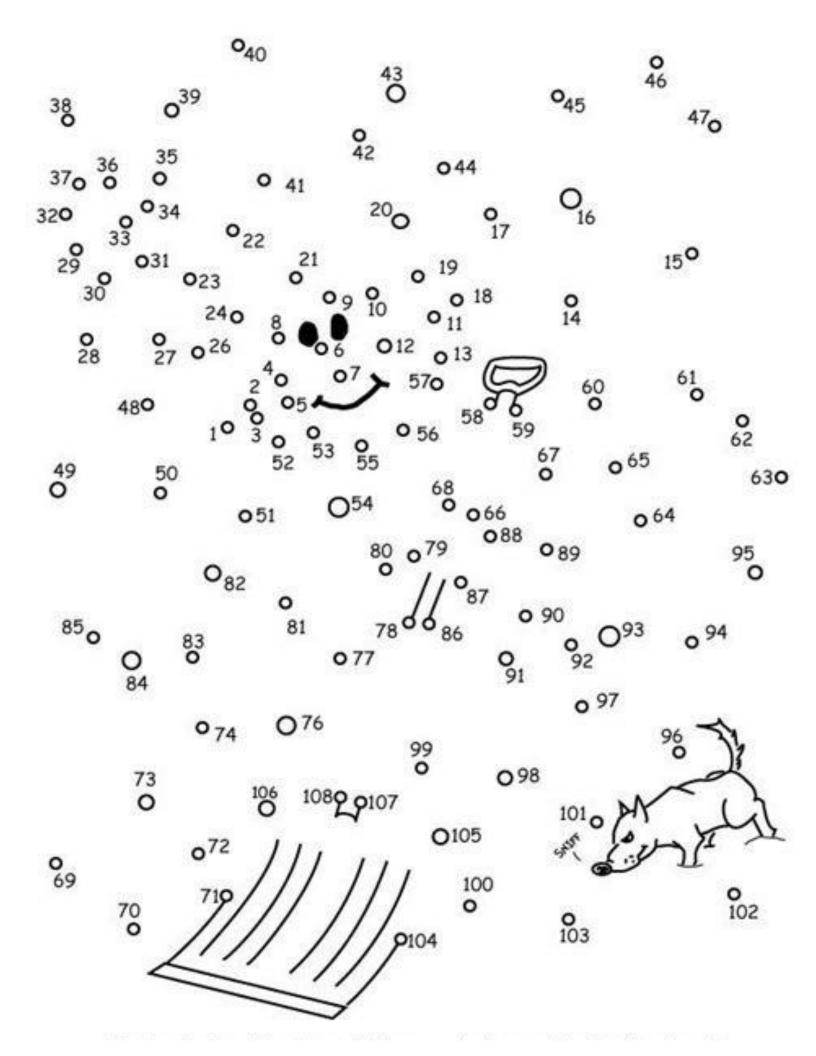
Livstock Judging

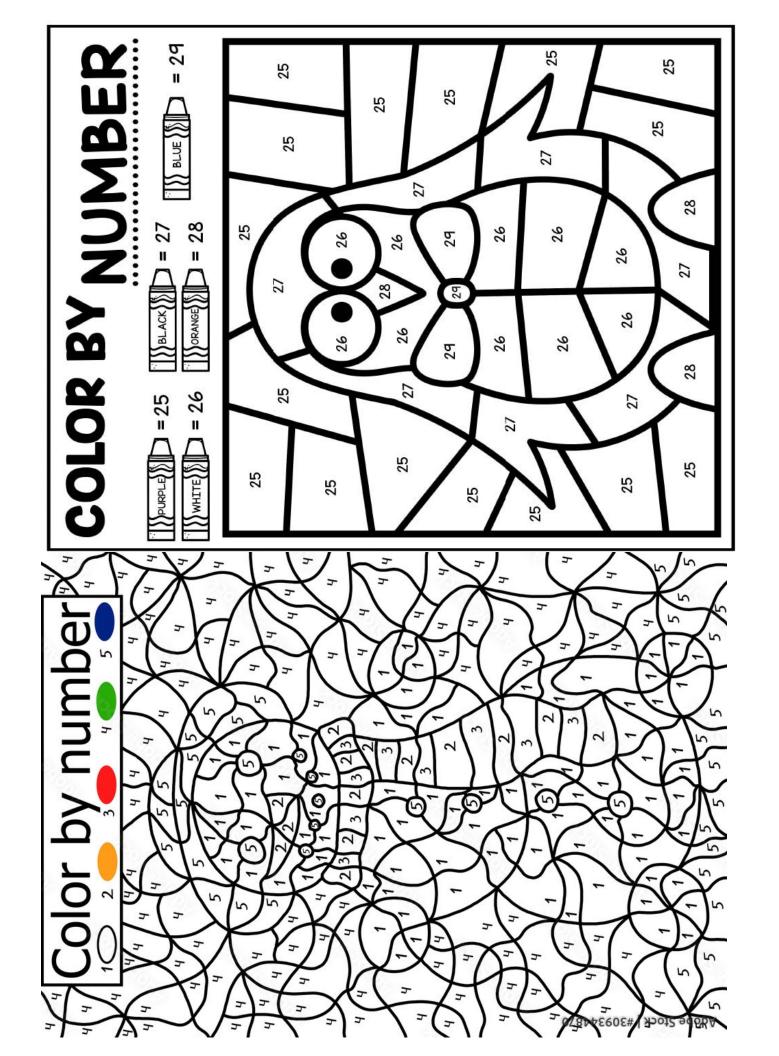

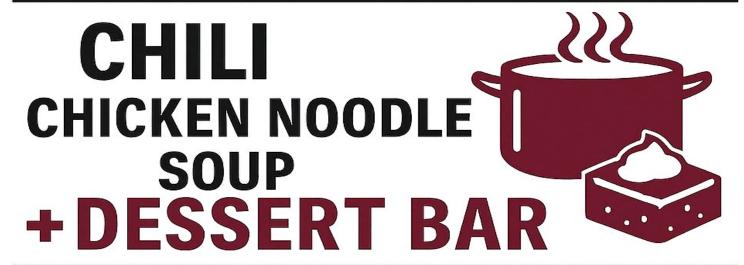
