From the Superintendent's Desk

We are already half way through a quarter of school. I would like to thank all the parents/guardians who attended Parent/Teacher Conferences on September 20. We had a great turnout for both elementary and secondary conferences. Having conferences around week five of the school year allows teachers the opportunity to touch base with parents/guardians on items going well for their student, and sometimes when they are struggling in certain areas. Your continued support throughout the school year is greatly appreciated.

The budget and levy were set at the September 10, 2018 budget hearing and regular board meeting. The levy decreased to (0.534671), which is 0.007 lower than last year. The tax request overall decreased \$63,687 from last year totaling \$2,481,767 this year. The General Fund budget of \$3,434,000 was set for the 18-19 school year and the Special Building Fund asking of \$0.010881 generating \$50,505 this school year. St. Edward School district continues their strong financial standing for this school year and future.

Students have been busy with activities to begin the school year. FCCLA and FFA have each attended events/conferences and the band has marched at the state fair. Elementary students have been to the state fair. The cross country teams have traveled to four meets with many runners setting personal best times on each course. The football team is currently 1-3 and the Junior High team is 1-1. The volleyball team has four wins and the Junior High A team have dropped both matches and the B team has one win and one loss so far this young season. I am looking forward to watching the students and athletes perform at the rest of the fall activities.

We are striving to utilize the messenger system to communicate updates on events/ cancellations. The school staff and administration is using a weekly announcement form to keep students and their families informed on activities during the school day and activities that occurring after school. Of course we have the monthly calendar of events on the website, but you can go to the Quicklinks tab on the website to access the weekly announcements. The weekly announcements will be the most up to date information for the current week, as it is done on a weekly basis. You will be able to see lunch menu, leave times/game times for events, as well as events occurring during the day, such as testing or early outs. The announcements are also posted in the hallway for students to reference the most current information. The new website is www.stedpublicschool.org. We will soon have an app for android and iPhone, so a messenger will be sent when those can be accessed.

Kindergarten and First grade: 3:00 pm – 3:30 pm





Senior students and parents...start preparing for college admission!


College may still seem far off, but admission deadlines will start hitting later this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

Contact your top colleges NOW and ask about application deadlines for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid; if you need a separate application for scholarships; and about application fees.

Visit with college representatives at College Fairs, Educational Planning Programs, during campus visits, and when they visit your high school.

Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline. Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay and an interview.

Don't forget to look for the scholarship page on the college's website to see what you need to do to apply for their scholarships.
