# The Other Side of the Den

It is already September, unbelievable! The student reading groups might look a little differently this year, so don't be alarmed! The kindergarten, first, and second grade teachers are undertaking a research based strategy to improve student reading ability named MTSS: Multi-Tier Systems of Supports during the 2018-2019 school years. The third, fourth, fifth and sixth grade will follow this strategy during the 2019-2020 school years. During the current year the third, fourth, fifth and sixth grade will continue the same as last year.

To summarize the diagram: the bottom portion of the pyramid is when all students are presented the reading information named the universal interventions. The majority of the students 80%-90%

should understand what is being taught to the whole group. If the student doesn't understand what is being taught the 5%-10% students move to a small group, middle portion of the pyramid, where the material is presented again in a different manner. A teacher will work with the student until they are back to grade level, usually within 3 to 4 weeks. If a student is still learning the same skill and needs more repetition 1%- 5% of the students will move to the top portion of the pyramid when they will receive one-on-one assistance on the skill until mastered. There are several groups meeting simultaneously throughout the day with different teachers, this is named an intervention. Intervention is outside of the regular reading period. MTSS is a regular classroom strategy for all students based off of data.


The teachers and I are attending MTSS meetings throughout the year, as well as the ESU staff developer Brooke Kohila meeting once a month at 7:00 am with the teachers and myself to review data, leading us through the process.

# ACT TESTING EXPLAINED



**Why should I take the ACT?** Most post-secondary schools require some time of an entrance exam to receive acceptance into their schools and the ACT is the most widely required test for our area. If you are planning to attend a four-year school, you will need to take the ACT exam. Some students ask about taking the SAT. Many colleges on the coasts require this test for entrance, but almost all in the Midwest require or will accept the ACT. Most two year colleges or technical schools will accept the ACT but they will also take the scores of the Accuplacer test. This is given onsite at those schools and is free. Check online to see what your school requires.

**Who should take the ACT?** I strongly encourage Juniors and Seniors to take the ACT test right away and to take it more than once. Sophomores are also encouraged to begin taking the ACT because research has shown that the chances of increasing your ACT score are better the more times you have taken the test. As a Sophomore you may not have covered all the material that is tested but it helps you become familiar with the format of the test. Seniors especially need to be aware of the requirements of their colleges as many colleges are beginning to only accept ACT scores through December of the sixth semester. Schools will accept the highest score earned whether it is the first or the fifth time the ACT was taken.

**Do I need to take the Optional Writing Test?** Currently the key word is optional. You will need to check with your college to see if they require you to have this part of the test for admission requirements.

**Where are the tests given?** The tests are given across the nation on the same day. The website [act.org](http://act.org) will list the dates.

**How do I register?** ACT has switched to online registration at [act.org](http://act.org). An informational flyer is available outside of my office. You will need an American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa Credit card OR a voucher if financially eligible.

**What is the fee?** The Basic Fee for testing is listed on the website. If you miss the first deadline you can register during the late period if you pay more money.

**How can I prepare for the test?** You can find ACT test preparation materials at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). I have a practice packet by my office. There are also ACT prep classes offered around the area, some for a small fee.

**Are there any accommodations made if I have a disability?** Yes, there are a number of accommodations that can be made. To find out if you qualify, find more information at the websites below.

**Are there fee waivers?** Yes there are. See me for more information about this. In order to qualify for a fee waiver from ACT students must meet all three eligibility requirements: 1) Student's family receives public assistance, be a ward of the state, reside in a foster home, participate in free or reduced lunch, be in a TRIO program or family income is at or below a certain allotment. 2) Student must be a junior or senior. 3) The fee waiver is only a one-time use.

**Very Important:** Use our school code when registering: **282-070**. If you forget the code it will cost you \$\$\$ to get your results sent to me. For more information see [www.act.org](http://www.act.org) and [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). You can find a wealth of information, materials to download and up-to-date information at both sites.

**What if I'm going to a 2 year college, do I need the ACT?** You have a couple of options. You do not need the ACT but you do need an entrance exam. You can take the ACT if you like but the Accuplacer is another test required and accepted. It is given right at the college campus and the best part is it is FREE!!! You just need to contact the college testing/placement office to schedule a time to take the test.

### Senior students and parents...start preparing for college admission!

College may still seem far off, but admission deadlines will start hitting later this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

**Contact your top colleges NOW** and ask about application deadlines for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid; if you need a separate application for scholarships; and about application fees.

**2. Visit with college representatives** at College Fairs, Educational Planning Programs, during campus visits, and when they visit your high school.

**Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline.** Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay and an interview.
