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The first quarter has come to a close, and we are three weeks in to our second quarter. Our students are growing and learning each day, and we want to thank the parents for your support of the school and all of the hard work you invest in your student's education. Our staff works hard, and I would like to thank them for all that they do each day in serving our students and working to make each day the greatest day possible.

We had our Fall Break, and it seemed that winter came just a little early this year with our first snow. There are some days on the school calendar in November to make a special note of on your calendars for planning purposes. These days are the 22nd, 23rd and 24th as there will be No School due to the Thanksgiving Holiday. Please enjoy your families and have a relaxing, enjoyable and rewarding Thanksgiving Holiday.

As I mentioned in last month's message, with winter weather approaching and now upon us, we remind you please use extra caution when picking up and dropping off students to avoid unnecessary congestion and compromise the safety of our students during inclement weather. It sometimes may seem more convenient to take "shortcuts" during this process which may lead to placing children in less safe situations.

Following is some additional and important winter information. When the ***AccuWeather windchill factor*** is 20 degrees Fahrenheit or below, the students will be allowed to enter the building upon arrival to school prior to the entry bell sounding and wait in an orderly manner for entry into the classrooms. The doors will be unlocked for breakfast at 7:25 a.m. as usual. The students who participate in the breakfast program, will eat breakfast and remain seated in the cafeteria until entry into classrooms.

When we experience inclement weather severe enough to cause a late start or a school closure, will make the announcement, first and foremost, through the district's JMC Messenger Mass Notification System. We will also utilize local news media. Inclement weather information is currently broadcast regularly by the following radio and television stations. 1. Radio: KLIR – FM 101.1; AM 900; FM 110.3; FM 93.5; AM 1510 (Columbus) 2. Television: KOLN –KGIN, channel 10 (Lincoln). Stay tuned to these information sources for winter weather information.

Our fall activities have come to a close for the 2023 seasons. I would like to congratulate all coaches and participants for the success and positive learning experiences they encountered during their seasons. Junior high wrestling practice is already underway with our Newman Grove cooperative, and other junior high sports will begin very soon. High school winter activity practices will officially begin on Monday, November 13th with competition beginning in the near future. Some winter conditioning activities will begin the week of November 6th. I am looking forward to our players, coaches, and spectators representing St. Edward Schools and the NGSE Cooperative with a great competitive spirit while displaying excellent sportsmanship.

In closing, please remember to turn your clocks back one hour on November the 5th as "daylight savings time" comes to an end. Thank you for your time and make November 2023 a great month.

The Homecoming Dance was right after the coronation. The theme was Barbie. Barbie themed snacks and drinks were provided.

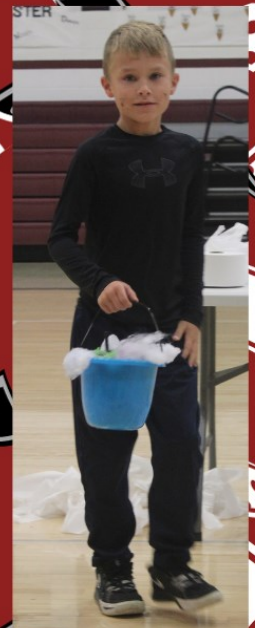
