#### BOARD OF EDUCATION REGULAR MEETING

St. Edward School Science Room – St. Edward, Nebraska Monday, June 12, 2023 7:00 p.m.

The St. Edward Public School Board of Education conducted a regular meeting on Monday, June 12, 2023 at the schoolhouse. Advance notice of the meeting agenda was published in The Albion News/Boone County Tribune on June 6, 2023.

1. Opening Procedures - Regular Meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Roberts at 7:01 p.m. with members Merrell, Cumming, Reardon present. Cruise arrived at 7:16 and Christman Arrived at 7:30. Also in attendance were Steve Osborn, Lindsay Tenski, Tyler Gray and Jan Green.

- 2. Approval of the Agenda:

a. Mr. Gray's Athletic Director Report:
