St. Edward is hosting Goldenrod Conference Music on March 27th with over 350 students from conference schools planning to be in attendance. Mr. Osborn's Report

Project Updates: We have an updated cost estimate on the concession stand window enlargement project which we started last year. The project was paused due to the need to remove more block than in the initial plan and leading to the need to relocate some electrical components. You will see the statement, "rewinding" the door from the old concession stand. If Fitchner Construction is unable to rewind this on their own, they will need the assistance from and overhead door company in accomplishing the task which may increase the cost; We have resumed the project of renovating the practice football field which we started last year. This project was also put on hold due to the delay in the installation of the water supply to the area. By the time we were able to have access to water, it was simply too late to complete the renovation process. We have 150 pounds of grass seed already, and we will need at least twice that amount in the \$700 range; We have issues with our other garbage disposer in the kitchen. The disposal was replaced today. The cost of this disposer will be in the hundreds rather than thousands. We replaced the current unit with a single phase, 110-volt unit which will adequately meet our needs for that particular sink area. The electrician is running the new line and should finish up tomorrow.

Staffing: Mrs. Texley announced her retirement last week and this is an action item on the agenda. This position is posted on the Teach in Nebraska Website. We have a para leaving in late March to begin another chapter in her career. We are working on a plan to finish this school year as well as prepare for next year in the area of our paraeducator assistance to students and staff. I have visited with some individuals who have expressed an interest in serving the school in this capacity. I have advertised for a replacement on the same website and locally as well; I have had conversations with a possible candidate for part time maintenance and who might possibly perform some custodial duties with the school. The candidate is giving it some thought and will get back to me.; At this time, I am not aware of any other potential vacancies prior to next school year; Included is a sheet outlining the years of service and the number of contract days on contracts for our certified staff for the 2024-2025 school year. This is an action item on the agenda.

Other information: Our fall 2024 NGSE coaches have been selected and we believe we have quality people ready to serve our students in the upcoming seasons. We are in the process of accepting applications for 2024-2025 winter coaching positions.

Upcoming Meeting and Conferences: The NRCSA Spring Conference is March 13-15, 2024 in Kearney. Cumming, Christman, Roberts, Merrell and Osborn are planning to attend; Boardsmanship Workshop on June 17, 2024 at the ESU 7 facility in Columbus.
